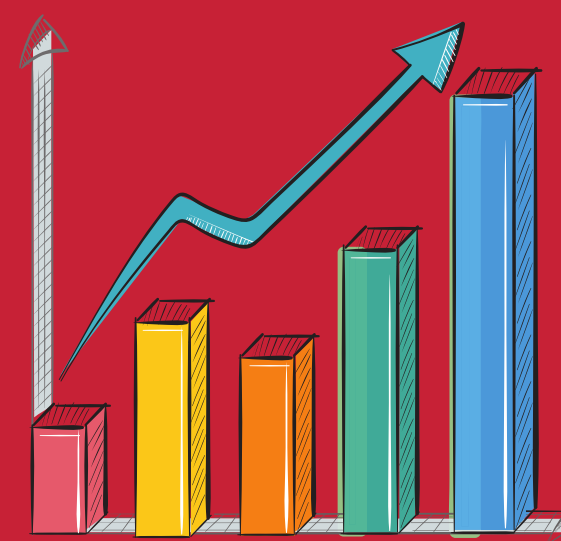
Universities in Ireland rank in the top 3% world-wide

REQUIREMENTS IN IRELAND



BACHELORS (3-4 YEARS)

- 12 Years of full-time education
- University: 70-90% in class 12th
- IOT : 70% in class 12th
- Colleges: 55-60% in class 12th
- IELTS: 6.5, no less than 6



MASTERS (1 YEAR)

- 15 Years of full-time education
- 55-75% in graduation
- IELTS: 6.5 no less than 6
- IELTS 6, no less than 5.5 is also acceptable in some institutions

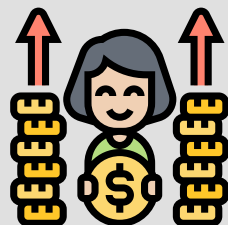

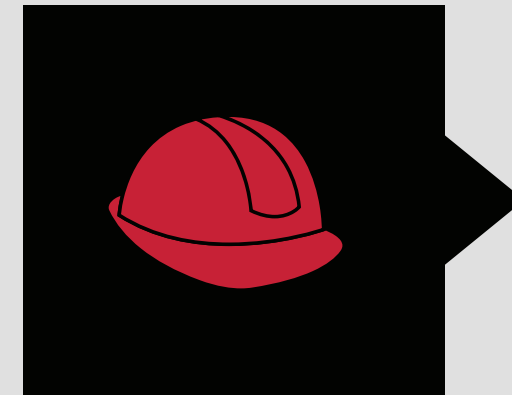

WORK WHILE STUDYING IN IRELAND

Students who are allowed to work part-time during the course session are granted Visa Stamp 2, while those who are not allowed to work part-time at all get the Visa stamp 2A.

Students holding a valid stamp 2:

- Permitted to work 20 hours a week during academics
- Permitted to work 40 hours a week during May, June, July, August, and from December 15 to January 15

To be eligible to work part-time, you need to be:

- Registered with local police known as Garda National Immigration Bureau or GNIB
- Accepted to a course recognized by the Minister for Education and Skills
- Enrolled in a full-time course at or above NFQ Level 7
- Attending classes between 8 AM and 6 PM per week
- Enrolled in a course with at least one year's duration
- If you are eligible to work part-time in Ireland, need to acquire a PPS Number (Personal Public Services Number) - employer won't be able to pay without a PPS no.



POST STUDY WORK IN IRELAND

Students can apply for a non-renewable extension of up to 2 years after course completion. This extension is granted for the purpose of finding suitable employment



Later on, you can apply for a green card (renamed Critical Skills Employment Permit) or work permit (renamed General Employment Permit).



Rather, if you wish to continue working and living in Ireland, you need to apply for Stamp 4 permission, and your minimum annual salary should exceed 30,000 euros

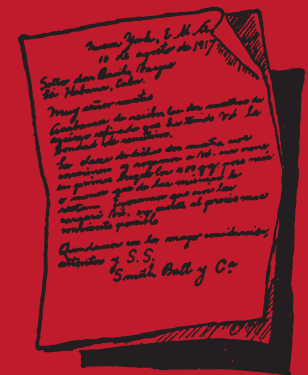

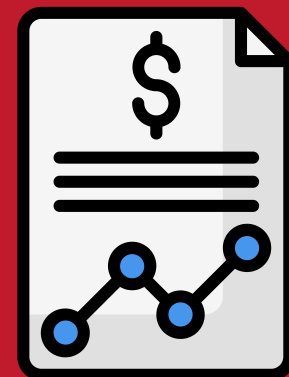
